- Greater recognition of capabilities, skills and successes
- Increase in opportunities for peer mentoring
- Greater, more valued role as a member of the community

Tips to Promote Inclusion in Employment

- Believe that your son or daughter can and should have a job in the community
- Look for natural connections in the community for your son or daughter i.e. where you regularly shop for groceries, buy your morning coffee, rent movies
- Find the "Gate Keeper" at those locations the person who can help to make the connection between your son or daughter and the person responsible for hiring



- Support your son or daughter to practice answering interview questions (in whatever way he or she communicates) and review interview etiquette i.e. shake hands, eye contact
- Model for your son or daughter. Show your son or daughter how to interact with others in a work environment and then fade out as they begin to engage.
- Forget past negative experiences and focus on potential and future successes! If something doesn't work, try something different or someplace new. Sometimes it takes a while to find your niche!
